## Why our Global Neighbours work matters

- 1.6 billion people, or 1 in 4, in need of access to shelter.
- **More than 80%** of the world's population does not have legal documentation of their property rights.
- People living in poor conditions have a higher risk of illness and disability.
- More than 10 million people die each year from conditions related to substandard housing.

### Empowering Families with People with Disabilities in Solola

In Guatemala, many families of people with disabilities are living in poverty. Most families that have members living with disabilities do not have access to a safe home, lacking basic amenities like water, electricity, bathrooms or kitchens.

We have partnered with Habitat Guatemala to improve the quality of life of people with disabilities and improve community inclusion, growth and sustainability by building accessible and sustainable homes that include space for a commercial business, solar panels, rainwater harvest system, biodigester, smokeless stoves, water and washing stations, family garden and poultry farms.



- Building accessible sustainable productive homes that include space for commercial business adapted for people with disabilities, solar panels, rainwater harvest system, biodigester, smokeless stoves, water and washing stations, family garden and poultry farms.
- Accessible productive homes same as above without solar panels.
- Retrofitted accessible productive homes.
- Access to health care, nutritional programs, and education integration.
- Capacity building activities and training on livelihood, and advocating for empowerment.

#### Improved living conditions and settlements for ethnic minority people in Vietnam

Trần Thị Hằng, a 57-year old-woman, is the head of the household. She is a farmer who works in the rice and corn fields every day. She has to continue to work in order to support her 32-year-old daughter, Phan Thị Thái, who suffers from epilepsy.

When Phan Thị Thái's husband passed away three years ago, her mother became the primary caregiver for her and her five-year-old son, Hứa Văn Xuân. Hứa Văn Xuân attends kindergarten at a local school.

The family has been living in a temporary house, approximately 30 square meters, since 2015. The house is covered with a bamboo wall, has a temporary cement floor, and a degraded fibro cement (asbestos) roof causing leaks when it rains. The family also does not have access to a toilet and bathroom in this house.

The whole family has been dreaming of a decent house to live in and through this partnership they will soon be able to lift the walls of their new home.
